Third Grade Summer Reading



You are required to read *The Mouse & the Motorcycle* by Beverly Cleary. Then you may choose **one** of the following activities.

Activity One: Bookmark

What you will need: 8 ½ inch by 3-inch piece of heavy white paper

1. On the front of the bookmark, draw a picture that represents the most important part of the story and color it. Include the title, author, and your name.
2. On the back tell me what the story was about (summary); be sure to include the problem and solution. This should be done in sentences and your neatest printing or cursive.
3. Written parts should be done in your neatest cursive or printing.

Activity Two: Comic Strip

What you will need: 8 ½ by 11-inch paper (Please do not use a posterboard)

1. Create an amazing comic strip to show your favorite event in the story. Please include: the Title, Author, Illustrator, Your name.
2. Each comic strip should show what leads up to the event you chose, the event itself and what happens after each event. Please include color and dialogue (if it is needed).
3. Written parts should be done in your neatest cursive or printing.

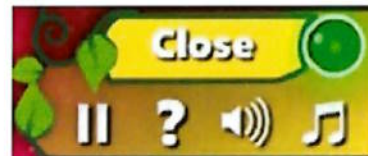
I highly recommend reading other books throughout the summer. The public libraries in the area have many fun programs that you can sign up for, with fun prizes and activities as well!

Third Grade Summer Math

The dot starts out as solid black



The solid green dot means that your child has spent the right amount of time for that session.



The goal over the summer is to maintain your math facts! In third grade, we focus heavily on these math facts and use them every day. Reflex will help your child remember them. It is very important that you achieve the “green dot” **three to four times a week**. All children will start with Addition and Subtraction at the beginning of summer, then halfway through they will be switched over to Multiplication and Division. There are some children who have not yet started Multiplication and Division, this will give them some exposure, so that during the year the transition to them is easier. The goal for all sets of facts is to fill in the pyramid like the example below.
